Principal's Message

Do All for the Glory of God When God is Glorified with Homework



When is God glorified with Homework? As I was thinking about this, I came upon this explanation. "I will write briefly about the importance of completing homework in the time and manner prescribed by the teacher. Spiritually, this is part of God's will for our faithful use of time and abilities, and it honors those in authority.

When our children develop responsibility for their homework, it leads to many applications in their life in general. Most importantly it helps them master and remember the concepts being taught. It also defines them as being dependable and trustworthy and instills a sense of duty and responsibility.

As a result they gain confidence to take on new experiences. Perhaps one of the most important blessings God gives our children as they learn to develop homework responsibility is that it prepares them for the bigger and more important responsibilities that life brings. If a person is responsible with little things, he will be given charge of greater. If someone cannot handle the small or unimportant things, why would someone entrust them with something of real value."

Jesus pointed out in his parable, "Well done, good and faithful servant! You have been faithful with a few things; I will put you in charge of many things." (Matt. 25: 31) "

Even though homework may seem to our children as mundane or pointless at times, through faithful completion of it, God is preparing our children for greater works of service.

Policy Reminders

Kansas Law 72-1113 states that if a child is unexcused from school for 3 consecutive days, 5 days in a semester or 7 days in a year then they are considered truant. All cases of truancy are required by Kansas Law to be reported to the appropriate authorities.

2.3.6 After a student has received 5 unexcused tardies, they will be marked with 1 day absent. Five unexcused tardies = 1 day absent.

2.3.7 The failure of a student to attend at least 85% of all days per quarter may result in a failing grade and/or retention in the student's current grade at year's end. Excessive absences, whether excused or unexcused, prevent the student from receiving beneficial instruction from the teacher. (20 days absent will result in retention or summer school.) Exceptions may be made for a prolonged physician diagnosed illness with completion of academic requirements at home.
