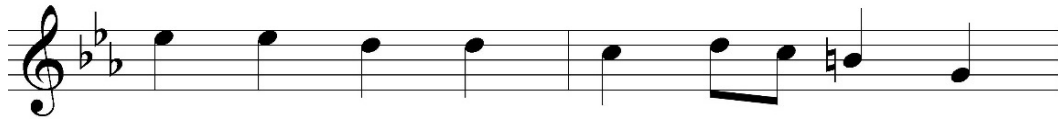
In the Garden I Betrayed Him
